Hrishikesh Kokate-MBAII Drone Technology in Agriculture Drone use is expanding quickly across practically all economic sectors, but it is particularly strong in the agricultural sector. The market for agricultural drones is predicted to increase from a \$1.2 billion (USD) sector in 2019 to a \$4.8 billion industry in 2024, according to certain projections. In a few years, drone use on big and small farms will be

increasingly commonplace, from reconnaissance to security. Drone-based data collection on farms is part of a system known as "precision agriculture" and is frequently used to better inform agronomic decisions.

Plant Health Monitoring

Plant health monitoring is one application for drone imaging that has already been widely used with remarkable effectiveness. The Normalized Difference Vegetation Index (NDVI), a specialized imaging tool used by drones, uses precise color data to assess the health of plants. This enables farmers to keep an eye on crops as they develop so that any issues can be resolved quickly enough to save the plants. Simply said, this graphic demonstrates how NDVI functions.

Crop health is also monitored by drones equipped with "normal" cameras. To monitor crop growth, density, and coloration, many farmers already use satellite imagery. However, accessing satellite data is expensive and frequently less efficient than closer drone imaging.

Field conditions monitoring

The condition of the field and the health of the soil are both being monitored via drone field monitoring. Drones can accurately map the field, providing elevation data that enables producers to identify any field abnormalities. The ability to determine drainage patterns and wet/dry patches, which enable more effective watering practices, is facilitated by knowledge of field elevation. Using improved sensors, several sellers and service providers of agricultural drones also provide soil nitrogen level monitoring services. This makes it possible to apply fertilizers precisely, removing troublesome growth areas and enhancing soil health for years to come.

Spray Application

In south-east Asia, the use of drones to apply spray treatments is already pervasive; South Korea uses drones for over 30% of its agricultural spraying. Drone sprayers can maneuver through highly challenging terrain, such as steep tea fields at great altitudes. Drone sprayers spare workers from carrying backpack sprayers through fields, which can be harmful to their health. In order to increase productivity and reduce chemical costs, drone sprayers offer very thin spray treatments that can be targeted to specific locations. Presently, laws governing drone sprayers vary greatly from nation to nation. They are currently illegal in Canada because additional research is required to fully understand the effects of spray drift.




Osheen Rudra Pal- BBA II WHIZ
